We are excited to announce that this year Whittier will be participating in the district-wide spelling bee. This opportunity is being offered to all 3rd through 5th grade students who are interested in participating in the spelling bee. There will be three different rounds of competition for the spelling bee.

Attached to this letter is the 2017-2018 School Spelling Bee Grade Level Study List. Students are encouraged to study their word list at home with their family and friends.

Rounds of Competition

1.) December 12th – Grade Level Spelling Bee

For this round, we will ask all students who are interested in participating in the spelling bee to come down to the multi-purpose room. Students will be given 25 words from the 2017 Spelling Bee Grade Level List to spell correctly. The top 8 students from each grade level will move on the school-wide spelling bee round.

2.) January 12th – School Spelling Bee

The top eight students from each grade level will come together in the multi-purpose room in the morning to compete against each other at our school spelling bee. Students will be asked to spell any word from the 2017-2018 School Spelling Bee List. **For the Spelling Bee, students will be asked to say the word, spell the word, and say the word again using a loud, clear voice. The school and district bees will also have one round of vocabulary, which includes stating the definition of the spelling word.** The winner of the school spelling bee will move on to round three and participate in the district spelling bee.

3.) January 23rd – District Spelling Bee

The one official school winner will represent Whittier in the Kenosha Unified School District Spelling Bee at Mahone Middle School at 9:00am.

1. **canal** (*noun*) an artificial waterway designed for navigation or for draining or irrigating land.
